MESSAGE FROM HEADTEACHER, MRS VILE

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Following the government's announcement that secondary schools will have a wider opening at some point in the summer term, I am writing to share with you the arrangements we are implementing to ensure the safety of all staff and students. These arrangements are being put into place following a robust risk assessment process.

I can confirm that school will continue to stay open on the 1^{st} June for the children of critical and key workers in the same way as we have for the last 9 weeks.

Students will not be expected to submit any work next week and we hope they use this time to relax and do the things that they enjoy most. Week beginning 1st June will be a 'pause week' for all students to enable them to catch up and complete their work which has previously been set. This has been requested through our surveys. If your child needs extension work this can be set by teachers on request.

Week beginning 8th June, work will be set on 365 Teams for all students.

Week beginning 15th June, a Blended Learning approach will be introduced initially for Years 10 and 12 to increase face to face opportunities for students with their teachers.





Staff will be planning and preparing for this approach from the 1st June.

We will continue to prepare the site and classrooms so that we are in a position to support a wider opening within school from the 15^{th} June where this is appropriate. I will update you with any changes as and when we make them.

MESSAGE FROM SCHOOL GOVERNORS

Governors had their second virtual meeting this week and will continue to do so every 2 weeks during this time. The new way of delivering lessons and work to students continues and we had excellent feedback that students are adapting well and have taken up the challenge, along with the teachers. We are aware that some students have had extra support to make sure they are able to access work. It is very important to us that all students can take part and continue with their studies.

As Government plans to begin the return to school for some year groups from 1 June, the most pressing thing for us is to work with Mrs Vile and school leaders to ensure the safety of everyone when this happens for high schools. Alongside this, Governors are aware of the impact things have had on people's well-being and how best to support students and wider school community over the next few months and beyond. Our Pastoral team have been updating Governors on support that will be put in place additional to what is currently available for pupils.

Finally, a few words from new parent governor, Kirsty Swift:

It was an honour to be elected as parent governor recently and have joined the board at a time of great challenge and uncertainty. I look forward to contributing to supporting the school in their regular work of educating our children, and ensuring that their emotional well-being is supported, as well as the tasks required as a result of current circumstances. This global pandemic, affecting everybody, is offering us an opportunity we have never had before to hold still for a moment, focus our priorities and come together as a community. We will get through this together, to a new normal on the other side. Stay safe and take care.


