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## MESSAGE FROM HEADTEACHER, MRS VILE

*I hope you and your families are all well.*

*The Prime Minister has announced the government's roadmap for how and when the UK will adjust its response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) crisis, this includes the phased return of some children to school. We look forward to welcoming our students back once it is safe to do so and have been busy planning and preparing to ensure we do this as safely as possible. We have carried out a comprehensive risk assessment and introduced control measures including a renewed cleaning schedule, installation of alcohol gel dispensers and increased promotion of the importance of washing hands throughout the school. - **Mike Ives**



*The staff of EPCHS were very sad to hear the news that Mr Ives who used to teach Chemistry at our school had passed away and our thoughts and prayers go out to his family and friends during this difficult time. I personally feel privileged to have had the opportunity to have been his colleague and friend for many years. The enthusiasm and commitment he had to the teaching profession was inspiring and there are a great many ex-students out there who are now recounting wonderful stories of how he made Science exciting through experiments and explosions. Behind the scenes of the mad scientist act, the care and compassion he had for his colleagues was admirable. He is a true loss to society. Below is a heart-felt tribute on behalf of past students from Jai Dillon who was a student with us between 2003 and 2010.*

### **Miss Briggs (Chemistry teacher)**

*I am sure I speak on behalf of the entire community when I say that Mike was one of the most engaging and influential teachers to have ever taught at Ellesmere Port Catholic High School. He was one of those people who had an infectious personality, a wicked sense of humour but above all a desire to have a positive impact on everybody he met or taught. Before even joining the school he made a lasting impression on future students; he was a favourite at the annual school open evenings with his infamous 'blowing up jelly-babies experiment'. This first encounter with him, left you with a desire to start the school and hope that he was your Science teacher. That same student engagement continued throughout every year and he always had a way of making you understand something. A Facebook group "Remembering Mike Ives" has been set up for people to share their stories and memories of Mike. In less than 24 hours over 700 ex-students and colleagues had joined the group qualifying that he was certainly one of those teachers you never forget.*



Tassomai is an app that turns the Science curriculum into quick to answer multiple choice quizzes that teach as well as test. The app continually adapts the content based on the student's previous answers enabling the questions to be tailored to their individual needs. Whenever an incorrect answer is given the correct answer is provided so the student can learn as they go along. It even gives them daily goals to complete to ensure that they stay on track. We have had really positive feedback from those students who have already managed to get started.
