Year 7 and 8 have now received an email with their usernames and passwords so they can access their MYON accounts. A step by step guide has also been sent to guide students and parents through the log on details and how to navigate the reading platform. Students have been asked to contact Mrs McHugh if they have any queries or problems logging on to their accounts.

Lexan - £1622 (£20 Amazon or Love to Shop voucher)


Hettie - £1489 (£10 Amazon voucher)

After a week of the Wellbeing Challenge, and a slow start for Year 10. The end of the week has seen Year 10 start to log miles, moving them away from school.




