Learning with us

Our curriculum includes taught lessons, applied learning visits and residential experiences against a background of working in a Catholic, Christian community founded upon the teaching of Christ in the Gospels. The promotion of British values is incorporated into the ethos of the school.

The curriculum reflects the National Curriculum and our belief in the need for a balanced and broad education. We know this to be the best means of assisting the young people in our care to grow as rounded and complete individuals, with an understanding of their own gifts and of the part they can play in the world.

Year 7 students will study Religious Education, English, Mathematics, Science, French, History, Geography, Physical Education, Music, Art, Technology, ICT and Drama.

There are a number of opportunities available to students throughout their time in school to participate in day visits and overnight stays on curriculum based activities, holidays and retreats directed towards spiritual and personal development. As you might anticipate the latter is a particular strength and feature of our school.

There is the chance for all to take part in daily prayer time and Liturgical celebrations both weekly on a voluntary basis and at particular significant points in the school year. The religious education programme is firmly rooted in the teachings of the Catholic Church.

Students are safe and feel safe at all times. They understand how to keep themselves and others safe outside of school. The school has a dedicated and timetabled PSHCE programme to address relevant and local issues.

Extended Learning

Extra-curricular activities broaden still further the opportunities for young people to grow and to experience success.

At Ellesmere Port Catholic High School we are extremely proud of the opportunities that we offer, whether this is part of our curriculum or through the wide range of activities, clubs, courses, fixtures, trips and residential experiences available to all students. It is testimony to the effort and commitment of so many staff that we can provide such a wide range of extra-curricular activities on a regular basis.

All our Year 7 pupils are encouraged to attend a whole year residential at the Menai Centre in North Wales.

Students are encouraged to take part in the many extra-curricular activities available after school. There is a wide range of sports for both boys and girls including netball, badminton, athletics, cross-country, rugby, football, trampolining, volleyball and basketball.

Other clubs and activities include Drama club, Music club, Arts club, Robotics, Debating club, Science club, and representation on the School Council.

We like to take every opportunity to showcase our student talents. They perform in weekly school assemblies and also at whole school events such as our annual Carol Service, Presentation Event and in school productions. Recent productions have included 'Grease', 'Beauty and the Beast' and 'The Wiz'.






Sixth Form

Communication with Parents

Communication is a two-way process. We want to keep parents informed of the progress of their children and to share celebrations or any concerns that we may have about behaviour or progress. Likewise we welcome feedback from parents and the opportunity to discuss any ideas or questions you might have.

Effective home school communication is essential to help support our young people. We make regular contact with parents in the forms of telephone calls, letters, emails and text messages. You will be able to speak with your child's form tutor, pastoral lead or subject teacher for information or support. Staff email addresses are available via the school website.

We do make formal arrangements to share information on progress with parents through the reporting system and during parents' and progress evenings. All students are issued with reports from their subject teachers during the year. These will recognise and celebrate areas where progress has been made and will provide a number of suggestions or actions that will secure the next steps towards further progress in each subject.

Parents' evenings are held for every year group each year, when parents have the opportunity to discuss their child's progress with their subject teachers, form tutor and pastoral lead. You will be formally invited to your child's parents evening near the time and a calendar of events will be published on the website at the start of each new academic year. Additionally we have a Year 7 progress evening in the first half term to ensure students have settled into life at Ellesmere Port Catholic High School.

Careers Advice & Guidance

Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) makes a major contribution to the education of all students. The school provides a stable, structured careers programme of information, advice and guidance for students to learn about employment, the world of work, the skills required and qualification pathways available to them. This is developed through the PSCHE programme starting in Year 7 to 13.



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
