'I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full' (John 10:10)


and we believe that every student here can achieve great things wherever their skills and talents lie.



We provide:


- A strong Catholic ethos

Our curriculum includes taught lessons, applied learning visits and residential experiences against a background of working in a Catholic, Christian community founded upon the teaching of Christ in the Gospels. The promotion of British values is incorporated into the ethos of the school.

The curriculum reflects the National Curriculum and our belief in the need for a curriculum which has breadth and depth. We know this to be the best means of assisting the young people in our care to grow as rounded and complete individuals, with an understanding of their own gifts and of the part they can play in the world.

Year 7 students will study Religious Education, English, Mathematics, Science, Spanish, History, Geography, Physical Education, Music, Art, Design and Technology, ICT/Computing and Drama.

There are a number of opportunities available to students throughout their time in school to participate in day visits and overnight stays on curriculum-based activities, holidays and retreats directed towards spiritual and personal development.

All our Year 7 pupils are encouraged to attend a whole year residential at the Menai Centre in North Wales.



Students are encouraged to take part in the many extra-curricular activities available after school. There is a wide range of sports for both boys and girls including netball, badminton, rugby, football, gymnastics and basketball.

Other clubs and activities include Drama club, Music club, Arts club, Robotics, Debating club, Science club, and representation on the School Council.

We like to take every opportunity to showcase our student talents. They perform in weekly school assemblies and also at whole school events such as our annual Carol Service, Presentation Event and in school productions. Recent productions have included 'Grease', 'Beauty and the Beast' and 'The Wiz'.




In 2021 our school successfully participated in the MYRIAD research project with the University of Oxford which learned about how schools prepare young people to manage emotional health and improve their resilience to the challenges of adolescence.

In January 2021 EPCHS was awarded the WOW Recognition Award for the Life on Mars project which saw pupils get astronomically creative. This was a joint venture between the school and careers education charity 4wardfutures.



In June 2021 our school was nominated at the Pearson National Teaching Awards for the 'Making a Difference – Secondary School of the Year' award. This was another excellent achievement for our school.



Careers Advice and Guidance

Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) makes a major contribution to the education of all students. The school provides a stable, structured careers programme of information, advice and guidance for students to learn about employment, the world of work, the skills required and qualification pathways available to them.



In December 2015 our school achieved Stage Two in working towards the inspiring IAG Gold Award.

Safeguarding and Students

We get to know all of our students and ensure a smooth transition from primary school. We have a Director of Care and Engagement dedicated to pastoral care who works closely with Pastoral Leads of each year group who get to know your child to understand their personality, abilities and social needs.

Students are known and valued as individuals. We know that everyone learns in different ways and progresses at different rates, so we work hard to understand how to support students at every step of their time with us.







We want all of our students to enjoy their education and we pride ourselves on good, open relationships with home to help make that happen.

Communication with Parents

Communication is a two-way process. We want to keep parents informed of the progress of their children and to share celebrations or any concerns that we may have about behaviour or progress. Likewise, we welcome feedback from parents and the opportunity to discuss any ideas or questions you might have.

Effective home school communication is essential to help support our young people. We make regular contact with parents in the forms of telephone calls, letters, emails and text messages. You will be able to speak with your child's Form Tutor, Pastoral Lead or Subject Teacher for information or support and monitor progress through the Arbor app.



We do make formal arrangements to share information on progress with parents through the reporting system and during parents' and progress evenings. All students are issued with reports from their subject teachers during the year. These will recognise and celebrate areas where progress has been made and will provide a number of suggestions or actions that will secure the next steps towards further progress in each subject.

Parents' evenings are held for every year group each year when parents have the opportunity to discuss their child's progress with their Subject Teachers, Form Tutor and Pastoral Lead. You will be formally invited to your child's parents evening near the time and a calendar of events will be published on the website at the start of each new academic year. Additionally, we have a Year 7 progress evening in the first half term to ensure students have settled into life at Ellesmere Port Catholic High School.
