


Our school Equality and Diversity Club are on Teams...



Hello everyone, and welcome to this week's Mrs McHugh's Library News! In this edition I'm going to celebrate the writing of Jason Reynolds! You may remember that I've recommended Reynold's book, **Ghost** before! It's a real page turner!



Synopsis: Running. That's all that Ghost (real name Castle Cranshaw) has ever known. But never for a track team. Nope, his game has always been ball. But when Ghost impulsively challenges an elite sprinter to a race -- and wins - the Olympic medallist track coach sees he has something: crazy natural talent. Thing is, Ghost has something else: a lot of anger, and a past that he is trying to outrun. Can Ghost harness his raw talent for speed and meld with the team, or will his past finally catch up to him?

I **love** reading Jason Reynolds books - I'm really happy to hear that he has just been awarded the UK's top children's books prize, the Carnegie medal for his "breathtakingly gripping" book of stories, **Look Both Ways**.

In **Look Both Ways**, Reynolds talks about difficult topics like homophobia, bullying and bereavement.



Reynolds was born in America and British Publishers were worried that his book wouldn't sell in the UK. However, Reynolds proved them wrong and his books are really popular in this country. Upon receiving the award Reynolds said...

"I wanted to show and to sort of pick at how – though we all exist in one space, and we all are pretty much the same when you get down to the brass tacks of it – we all have completely different journeys."




Why do I recommend this book?

This simple guide could help save the life of an adult one day, push to start...

What to do if someone is unresponsive and not breathing normally

- 1. Call 999/112 for emergency help
- Ask if an AED is nearby



2. Lay a piece of towel or clothing over the casualty's nose and mouth



3. Pump

- 30 chest compressions at a rate of 100-120 per minute
- Do not give rescue breaths
- Continue to pump until help arrives.
