

Each boy has a story and they all have something in common...

My thoughts about *Ghost Boys*: I honestly cannot find the words to describe this book...it's brutal, heart breaking yet uplifting. At times it made me cry but this emotion is *so* necessary. 






Exam stress even when there are no exams?
