Missing Children & Covid-19 Restrictions

The COVID-19 Pandemic has significantly disrupted the lives of young people. The routines and boundaries for many young people will have been significantly altered due to the lockdown measures that have been in place.

As we move in to a further national lockdown it is vital that parents and carers continue to report their child as missing if their whereabouts are unknown. It is appropriate to take steps to locate a missing child despite the current restrictions.

Reporting a Child as Missing – A Message from Cheshire Police

Reporting a child as missing is a necessary step to take to ensure that a child can be effectively safeguarded.

The police are entitled to expect parents and carers to accept normal parenting responsibilities and undertake reasonable actions to try and establish the whereabouts of the individual. This includes:

- Make attempts to contact them
- Call friends or family
- Visiting areas they frequent
- Visit place known to be attending (for example friend's house or party)
- Checking to see if any items are missing from the home.

Once those enquiries have been completed, it may be appropriate to record the child as missing and take actions set out in national police guidance.

Children who are breaching parental discipline should not be dealt with by police unless there are other risks.



Increased Risks during COVID-19 and Parent Resources

Young people are spending more time online during the COVID-19 Pandemic as a means of staying in touch with friends, entertainment and for education. While the internet can be a positive tool to support young people during this period, they can be targeted by perpetrators and exploited. It is essential that young people are effectively monitored and supported.

• Year 11 into the 6th Form Information

Dear all, normally this term there are a number of activities that take place to support and inform Year 11 students and parents/guardians in terms of their next steps post 16. In regards to admissions to our own successful 6th form all students would normally be able to attend a 6th form open evening with parents where they would get to speak to all the different subject areas about their courses. There would also have been a taster day where Year 11 become the 6th form for the day and be able to sample 5 A-Level lessons.

Unfortunately, these events will have to be done in a different way this year due to current restrictions, which I will outline below:

- All subject areas have now been asked to produce a ppt/video in which they will outline their courses. These will be available on the school website towards the end of this month and I will message parents when they are there.
- On 25th January at 9am the 6th form team will be speaking to all of Year 11 interested in coming back in their personal development lesson - I will start with a presentation on all aspects of our successful 6th form followed by a Q&A session where students can ask any questions they want answering about next steps and applications.

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- In March I will send out an online application form for initial choices each student will then be added to a Future Year 12 Microsoft team so that the 6th form team can communicate with them regularly and involve them in some of our extra-curricular activities.
- I will also have a meeting with each student around this time about their choices etc.
- In the summer when they have their final results students will be given a final application form in case they have changed their minds about subject choices.

My initial video outlining all aspects of the 6th form provision including subject choice and entrance requirements is also available in both the Year 11 Team and on the website.

All sessions are delivered virtually.


There are spaces for these sessions over the lockdown period, however, spaces are **LIMITED**.


Japan: Benjamin Blog and his Inquisitive Dog Guide (Level 4.7 / Quiz Number 226961)


