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#### Headteacher Message

We are very much looking forward to the staggered return of our students next week and feel confident that our alterations to the school building are compliant with the constantly evolving health and safety guidance.

#### **Face Coverings**

We are advising students to wear masks in corridors and communal areas, but at this time it is not compulsory.

#### From Department for Education...

Examples of where education leaders might decide to recommend the wearing of face coverings – for students and staff - in communal areas of the education setting include:

- where the layout of the school or college estate makes it particularly difficult to maintain social distancing when staff and pupils are moving around the premises
- where on top of hygiene measures and the system of controls recommended in the
  full <u>opening guidance to schools</u> and <u>FE colleges and providers</u>, permitting the use of face
  coverings for staff, pupils or other visitors would provide additional confidence to parents to
  support a full return of children to school or college.

It is vital that face coverings are worn correctly and that clear instructions are provided to staff, children and young people on <u>how to put on, remove, store and dispose of face coverings</u> in all of the circumstances above, to avoid inadvertently increasing the risks of transmission.

Safe wearing of face coverings requires cleaning of hands before and after touching – including to remove or put them on – and the safe storage of them in individual, sealable plastic bags between use. Where a face covering becomes damp, it should not be worn and the face covering should be replaced carefully.

On the basis of current evidence, in light of the mitigating measures education settings are taking, and the negative impact on communication, face coverings will not generally be necessary in the classroom even where social distancing is not possible.

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There is greater use of the system of controls for minimising risk, including through keeping in small and consistent groups or bubbles, and greater scope for physical distancing by staff within classrooms. Face coverings can have a negative impact on learning and teaching and so their use in the classroom should be avoided.
