Overall		<p>Students study and learn the core truths of the Catholic faith as found within the Sacred Scriptures, The Catechism, the writings of the saints and the Popes and documents of the Second Vatican Council. Such knowledge can be categorised as Beliefs, Teachings, Practices, Sources of Wisdom and Authority, and Forms of Expression.</p> <p>Students should also recognise that within Catholic Christianity there may be more than one perspective in the way beliefs and teachings are understood and expressed. Common and divergent views within the wider Christian tradition in the way beliefs and teachings are understood and expressed should be included throughout, including reference to Orthodox, Protestant and other Christian traditions.</p> <p>Due to a transition period in Summer of 2021 Year 10s will be having a half term unit where they will investigate, critically analyses and deeper their personal knowledge of wider Catholic rituals and traditions, that will embed into the Catholic Christianity paper.
