Just a reminder as well that next Friday (26th November) is INSET Day.



Relationship, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) Parent Consultation

Dear Parent / Carer

During the academic year 2020/21, Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) became statutory in all secondary schools in England.

As a Catholic school, our mission is to support the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of all of our pupils, rooted in the wisdom and teaching of the Church. The education of children in human sexuality is an important, precious and privileged responsibility. The Church teaches us that this is very much a partnership with parents, in which parents are the 'first educators' of their children on these matters; ultimately, you confer on us the right to co-educate your children with you.

To support the teaching of RSHE, in January 2021, we adopted **Life to the Full** by Ten:Ten Resources. Ten:Ten is an award-winning Catholic educational organisation that is well-respected and very experienced in this field of work.

Life to the Full has been approved by our diocese. Furthermore, Ten:Ten entered into a partnership with the Catholic Education Service and the Department for Education to provide training for teachers in Catholic schools on the subject of the new statutory curriculum which a number of our staff successfully completed.

Ten:Ten understand the foundational role that parents and guardians have in educating and nurturing their children on these matters. Through their online programme, they have built in resources which will not only keep you informed about what is being taught in school, but will also give you the opportunity to engage your children in discussion, activity and prayer.

To support our school further, we would therefore like to gather feedback on our approach. To this end, we have opened a consultation period during which we welcome your feedback.

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Ten:Ten have provided an online **Parent Consultation Tool**. This is a simple-to-follow, short online course which:

- Outlines the statutory changes that have taken place.
- Articulates a vision for Catholic Relationships and Health Education.
- Explains how Life to the Full aims to help us fulfil the statutory curriculum with a Catholic ethos.
- Provides some information about key decisions we make, in consultation with parents.
- Answers some Frequently Asked Questions.

Ten Ten have also provided an **Online Parent Portal** to aid this process and we will be using it throughout the year to keep you informed and updated about the work we are doing in school in relation to RSHE.

<u>Virtual NHS Healthcare Work Experience Programme: November 2021 - April 2022</u>

This is a 6 month programme, one day per month, starting in November. During these work experience days, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. They will observe healthcare professionals as they interact with the patients and each other. They will have an opportunity to ask questions and gain knowledge through teaching. This will help them to make an informed career decision as well as learn about how healthcare professionals work together as part of a multidisciplinary team. Each work experience day is completely different. They will be able to build on their knowledge of NHS careers as they see different patient cases and healthcare professionals work in a variety of settings, such as hospital and community.

They will also receive certificates as evidence of having participated in the work experience

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programme. Those that complete the entire 6-month programme will be awarded with Highly Commended References too.
