It is both a privilege and a pleasure to share that I have been asked to continue as Acting Headteacher of our Catholic High School for the next academic year. I am deeply grateful for the trust placed in me and remain fully committed to serving our pupils, families, and wider community. I would also like to offer my warmest congratulations to Mr Cavanagh, who will be stepping into the role of Acting Deputy Headteacher, and to Miss Briggs, who will be taking on the position of Acting Head of Sixth Form. I am confident that, together, we will lead our school into another successful and enriching year.

It has been another busy and purposeful week in school, with a wide range of activities taking place. In sporting news, some of our Year 7 pupils took part in a session organised by the Cheshire FA, where they experienced what it might be like to play football with a disability—an insightful and thought-provoking opportunity for all involved. Our Year 8 boys' football team have also been hard at work preparing for their participation in the prestigious Shrewsbury School Tournament in July, including a valuable practice match against our Year 9 team earlier this week.

As part of our Sixth Form careers programme, we were delighted to welcome back Laura Brown, a former pupil, who spoke about her career journey in the field of Psychology since leaving EPCHS. On Friday, one of our parents also visited to speak to pupils about her role as Chief Pharmacist & Associate Director for Medicines Optimisation at the Cheshire and Wirral Partnership NHS Foundation Trust. These talks are invaluable in broadening our pupils' knowledge and understanding of the many pathways available to them when they leave school. Looking ahead, we have a number of important events taking place in the coming days. This weekend, many of our pupils will be completing their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award expedition. Firstly, please accept my apologies for the delay in providing an update regarding leadership at the school. As a governing board and trust, we have been working diligently over recent months to recruit a new headteacher, and this is the earliest opportunity to share our plans moving forward.

Following two rounds of a rigorous recruitment process, we have taken the decision not to appoint a substantive headteacher at this time. This was a unanimous decision across staff, governors and pupils, reflecting our shared view that we had not yet identified the right candidate for this critically important role.

I am, however, delighted to confirm that Mrs Henderson has agreed to take on the role of Headteacher at Ellesmere Port Catholic High School for the coming academic year. Lorraine has dedicated over 25 years of service to the school and brings a wealth of experience, commitment and deep understanding of the community to this position.

She will continue to be supported by Mr Beesley, who will serve as Executive Headteacher across Ellesmere Port Catholic High School and All Hallows Catholic College. This leadership model has been in place this year and has proven highly effective. We are confident it will continue to drive further improvement and positive outcomes. As you know, the school was visited by Ofsted this term, and when the report is published you will see clear evidence of the progress being made.

To further strengthen the leadership team, we are pleased to confirm two additional appointments from September: Mr Cavanagh will take on the role of Acting Deputy Headteacher, and Miss Briggs will become Acting Head of Sixth Form.

We are very confident that this strong and experienced leadership structure will enable the school to continue to flourish. We are also fortunate to have a dedicated and hardworking staff team who remain fully committed to delivering the very best for all pupils.

Re: Changes to sanctions

Dear Parents/Carers,

We hope you are well. Thank you for your continued support in helping us create a positive, calm and purposeful environment where every student can learn, develop and succeed.

At our school, we are committed to ensuring that expectations around behaviour are clear, fair and consistently applied. A key part of this approach is our use of detentions, which are not intended simply as a sanction, but as a structured opportunity for students to reflect on their choices, take responsibility, and re-engage positively with their learning. This process plays an important role in supporting students to develop self-discipline and uphold high standards.

The majority of detentions take place at the end of the school day (3:15pm) and follow a clear, graduated structure depending on the nature and seriousness of the concern:

- Class Teacher Detention: 3:15pm – 3:45pm
- Curriculum Leader Detention: 3:15pm – 4:00pm
- SLT (Senior Leadership Team) Detention: 3:15pm – 4:15pm
- Pastoral Leader Detention: 3:15pm – 4:15pm
- Late Gate Detention: 3.15pm - 3.35pm

Detentions are issued Tuesday to Friday.

It is important to note that if a detention is missed, it will escalate through our system. For example, a missed Class Teacher detention may be referred to a Curriculum Leader, with continued non-attendance resulting in escalation to the Senior Leadership Team (SLT). At this stage, more serious sanctions may be applied, which can include time in our isolation facility (the Pope Francis Centre), Step-Out placements to other schools, or, in more serious cases, suspension.

We ask for your support in:

- Reinforcing with your child the importance of positive behaviour in school
- Ensuring that if your child does receive a detention, they understand the importance of attending it promptly
- Making any necessary arrangements so your child can stay until the detention ends

Your support is essential in ensuring this system is effective. When students attend and complete detentions as expected, it helps us maintain consistency across the school and reinforces the importance of accountability. This, in turn, supports a safe, focused environment where all students can thrive.

By working together, we can continue to uphold high standards and ensure every student has the opportunity to succeed. Thank you for your continued support.

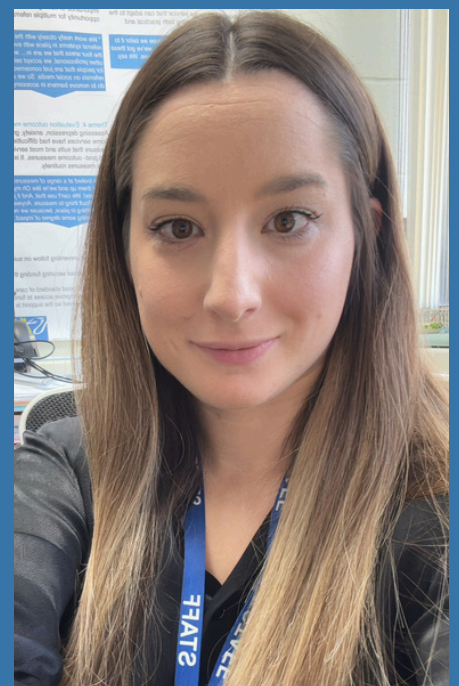


This week, Year 12 welcomed Dr Laura Brown, a former EPCHS pupil and current parent, who is a lecturer in psychology at University of Chester.

'Future Ready' Programme Inspires Year 8 Students



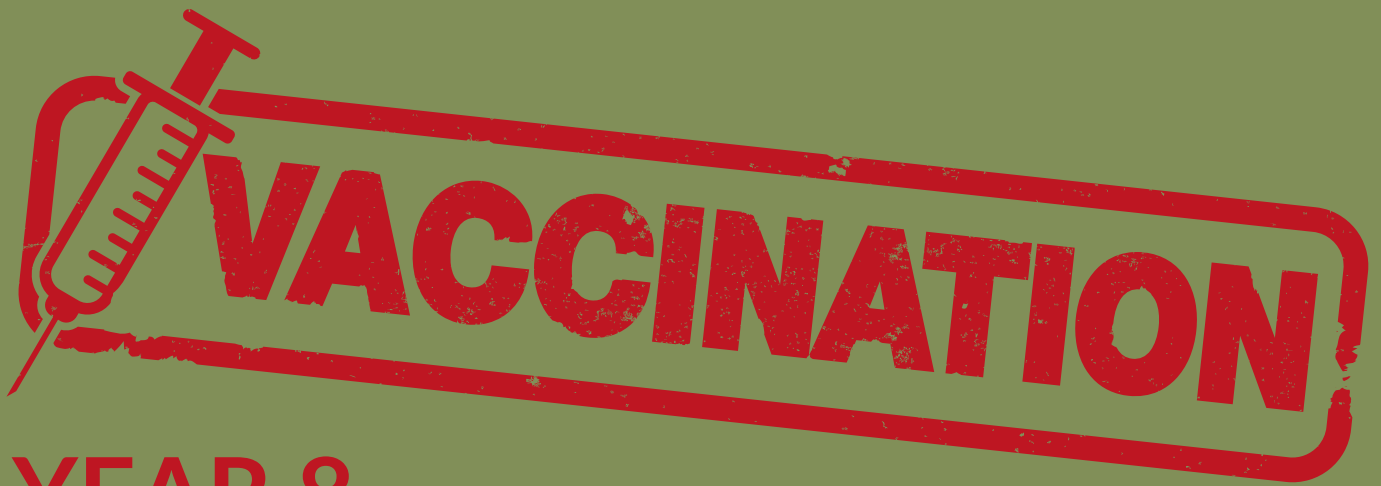

BRONZE EXPEDITION UPDATE

The DofE team are really looking forward to seeing how our Bronze students take on their final expedition this weekend. They will be completing their assessed expedition from Sunday 14th to Monday 15th June.

Our students have worked hard in their teams throughout the year during after-school training sessions, building key skills in navigation, campcraft and teamwork. Throughout the day, our students demonstrated excellent resilience, adaptability and teamwork as they learnt new ways to communicate and play the game. The activities were both enjoyable and thought-provoking, encouraging students to develop a greater appreciation of inclusivity in sport.

A particular highlight was meeting two members of the England Visually Impaired Football Team, who shared their inspiring journeys and answered students' questions about their experiences in the game.



Students also had the opportunity to try amputee football, widely regarded as the most challenging activity of the day. Joined by two players from Everton Amputee Football Club, they witnessed first-hand the incredible skill, determination and athleticism required to compete at a high level.

Despite the rainy weather, the day was a tremendous success and provided a memorable learning experience for everyone involved. Our students represented the school brilliantly and returned with a greater understanding of the importance of inclusion, perseverance and opportunity in sport.

We look forward to sharing this memorable and enriching experience with our visitors.

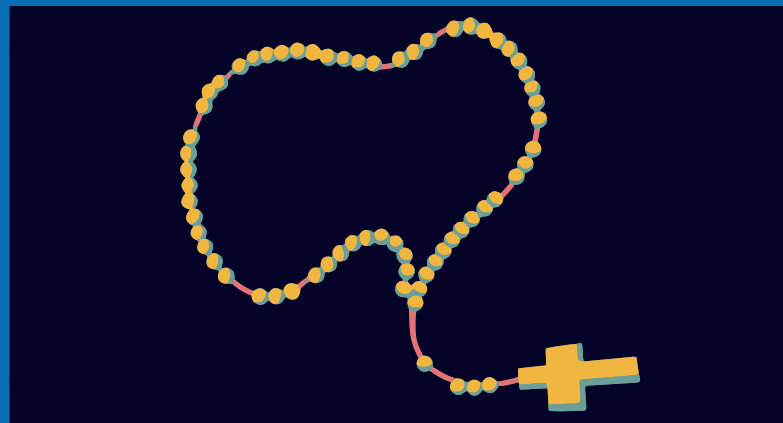

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about SPORTS BETTING ONLINE

Sports betting online involves placing wagers on real-world sporting events through websites, apps, and linked accounts. In the UK, licensed gambling is illegal for under-18s, yet young people may still encounter betting through sports coverage, social media, gaming spaces, friends, or adult accounts. With gambling content increasingly visible online, parents and educators should help children understand the risks, financial impact, pressure, and how to make safer choices.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

EASY ONLINE ACCESS

Online sports betting sites and apps are widely available and can be accessed through phones, tablets, computers, and, indirectly, gaming or social platforms. Some young people may attempt to bypass age checks using false details or someone else's account. Digital wallets, prepaid cards, and saved payment details can also make spending harder to notice, increasing the risk of discreet or impulsive betting.

PEER AND INFLUENCER PRESSURE

Social media influencers, online tipsters, and sports content creators can make betting appear fun, profitable, or part of being a committed fan. Young people may feel pressure to copy this behaviour, especially when friends talk about odds, accumulators, or predictions during matches. Gambling advertising rules aim to protect under-18s, but children can still see persuasive betting content in online spaces.

FREE BET OFFERS

Online betting platforms often use free bets, bonus credits, or 'risk-free' promotions to attract users. These offers can make gambling seem safe or low commitment, but they usually include terms and conditions that young people may not understand. A free incentive can lead to real spending, repeated deposits, or the belief that gambling is easier to control than it is.

NORMALISING GAMBLING BEHAVIOUR

Online sports betting can make gambling feel like a routine part of watching sport. Young people may begin to see odds, predictions, and wagers as harmless entertainment rather than as financial risk. This can also blur boundaries with other gambling-like activities, including loot boxes, skins betting, or casino-style games, making later gambling feel more acceptable or familiar.

ADVERTISING AROUND SPORT

Young people can be exposed to betting brands through sports broadcasts, social media, sponsorship, pitch-side advertising, and content linked to major fixtures. Repeated exposure may make gambling seem normal, glamorous, or expected as part of the sport. Without adult guidance, children may connect betting with excitement, loyalty, and success, rather than understanding that gambling is designed to make money from customers.

CHASING WINS AND LOSSES

A winning bet can create excitement and encourage a young person to try again, while a losing bet may lead them to place another wager to win back the money. This is known as chasing losses. Because online bets can be quick, small, and available at any time, children may not recognise how rapidly repeated decisions can become costly and emotionally harmful.

Advice for Parents & Educators

START EARLY CONVERSATIONS

Talk openly with children about how betting works, including odds, losses, advertising, and the fact that gambling companies are commercial businesses. Use examples they may recognise, such as betting adverts during football matches, influencer predictions, or online tipsters. Keep the tone calm and curious, so that children feel able to ask questions, share concerns, and discuss pressure from friends without fearing punishment.

EXPLORE ONLINE EXPOSURE

Ask which apps, websites, games, sports channels, and social media accounts children use around live sport. Betting content may appear through adverts, sponsorship, livestreams, tipster pages, or discussions between friends. Watching a match together can help you point out gambling messaging in real time and explain how it is designed to influence choices, normalise betting, and encourage spending.

SET SAFER BOUNDARIES

Use device, app store, and bank settings to limit spending, block gambling transactions where possible, and require adult approval for purchases. Check payment histories for unfamiliar withdrawals, digital wallet use, or repeated small transactions. These safeguards work best alongside clear conversations, helping children understand that online payments are still real money, even when they feel quick, hidden, or invisible.

NOTICE AND SEEK SUPPORT

Look out for secrecy around devices, sudden interest in odds, requests for money, unexplained spending, mood changes linked to sports results, or late-night phone use. Respond with support first, then gather information and seek specialist advice where needed. Organisations such as GambleAware, Ygam, GAMSTOP, and the Gambling Commission provide information about gambling harms, education, blocking tools, and support routes.

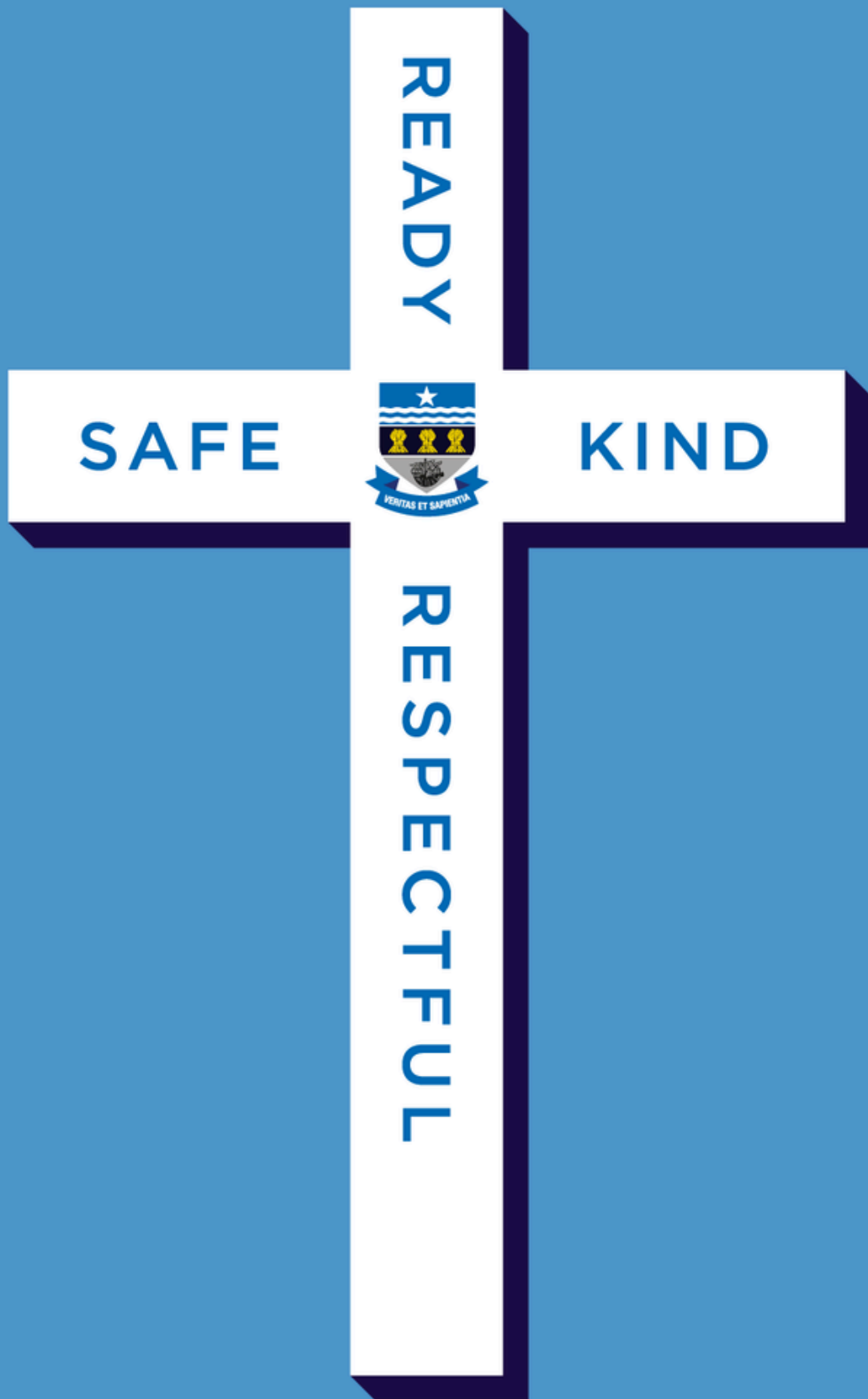
